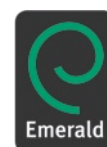

The 14th Maxwell Jones Lecture

Speaker: Professor Edgar Jones (Professor of the History of Medicine and Psychiatry, Programme Leader for the MSc in War and Psychiatry, King's Centre for Military Health Research, Institute of Psychiatry).

Respondent: Dr Tom Harrison (Retired consultant psychiatrist, author of Bion, Rickman, Foulkes and the Northfield Experiments).

The number of UK veterans who fought in the 13-year conflict in Afghanistan increased significantly last year, and veterans from the Iraq war are still presenting themselves for treatment five years after the conflict ended. TCs led the way in the treatment of veterans during WW2 and continue to help traumatised veterans today. In this centenary year of WW1 the lecture will look at the effects of war on soldiers and what contributes to recovery.

Directions

Cumberland Lodge has plenty of free parking and is easily accessible by public transport.

By Rail

There are fast trains from London Waterloo and Reading to Egham (not Windsor). The journey time from London is about 35 minutes.

By Taxi

There is a taxi rank at Egham Station, and a taxi office 100 yards away on Station Road. The approximate fares to Cumberland Lodge are about £9 from Egham, £25 from Heathrow, and £65 from Gatwick.

By Car using Sat Nav.

Please note that for Crown Estate legal reasons, GPS Sat Nav Systems do not work within the Great Park. However, they do work for Bishopsgate Road, Englefield Green, TW20 0XU, which is just outside the Bishopsgate entrance to the Park, and SL4 2JA is for drivers coming from the Windsor and Ascot direction using the Ranger's Gate entrance.

By Air

Heathrow Airport is twenty minutes by road. Gatwick Airport is forty minutes by car, or by rail via Victoria Station, Waterloo and Egham.
